**Cluster News**

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. As the cathedral church of Rome, the Lateran Basilica is identified by an inscription on its façade as the “*mother and head of all churches in Rome and the world.*” The dedication of a church is a feast for all its parishioners. St. John Lateran is, in a sense, the parish church of all Catholics, for it is the pope's parish, the cathedral church of the Bishop of Rome. This church is the spiritual home of the people who are the Church. Celebrating this Feast of the dedication of a church so many miles away is an opportunity for us to reflect on how we are united as Catholics and how we are called to grow together in love. St. Augustine speaks of this beautifully: "What was done here, as these walls were rising, is reproduced when we bring together those who believe in Christ. For, by believing they are hewn out, as it were, from mountains and forests, like stones and timber; but by catechizing, baptism and instruction they are, as it were, shaped, squared and planed by the hands of the workers and artisans. Nevertheless, they do not make a house for the Lord until they are fitted together through love" (St. Augustine, *Sermon 36*).

**Larcum Conference**

LARCUM Conference to be held in Portsmouth Nov 14 & 15<sup>th</sup> In observance of the Jubilee Year of Paul, this year's Virginia LARCUM Conference will focus on the experience of the Apostle Paul to the Gentiles in relation to Christian unity.

The statewide conference of the Lutheran, Anglican, Roman Catholic and United Methodist clergy and laity will be held on Friday and Saturday, Nov. 14–15, in Portsmouth's Olde Towne neighborhood. The theme will be “Paul and Christian Unity.” “Both the letters of Paul and the Acts of the Apostles tell of Paul's struggles with the differing infant communities in promoting unity,” said Msgr. Raymond Barton, Vicar of the diocese's Office of Ecumenical and Interreligious Affairs in a newsletter article on the conference.

Dr. Katherine Grieb, professor of New Testament at the Virginia Theological Seminary in Alexandria, will be the main speaker. A theologian and Scripture scholar, she has served on the Anglican Theological and Doctrinal Commission.

Both Bishop Francis X. DiLorenzo of Richmond and Bishop Paul Loverde of Arlington are expected to attend the LARCUM Conference.

The LARCUM Conference will open Friday at 6 p.m. with arrival and registration at Monumental United Methodist Church. An orientation will be provided to newcomers by the State Committee before the actual program begins.

The opening session will begin at St. Paul Catholic Church at 7 p.m. Dr. Grieb will examine issues facing Paul in his own words and the challenge of unity. The evening will conclude with a prayer service.

The sessions will begin on Saturday morning with registration and refreshments at Monumental Church at 8 a.m. At 8:30 participants will walk two blocks to First Lutheran Church for Morning Prayer. They will then return to Monumental Church for Dr. Grieb's focus on challenges to unity in her two presentations at 9 and 10:15 a.m. The conference will end at 3 p.m.

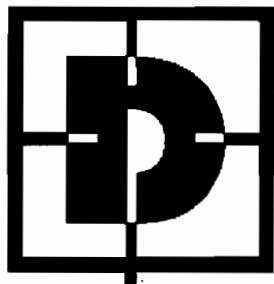
