We continue to celebrate a special year dedicated to St. Paul to mark the approximately 2,000th anniversary of the saint's birth. Pope Benedict announced this Pauline Year in June 2007 noting that it will run from June 28, 2008, to June 29, 2009. St. Paul was born in Tarsus, in what is now Turkey, at the start of the Christian era, sometime between A.D. 7 and 10, according to church historians. After his conversion on the road to Damascus, he became one of the church's foremost evangelizers, first among Jews, then among Gentiles. Citing St. Paul's dedication to Christ and his ministry, the Pope noted that "the action of the church is credible and effective only to the extent that Christians are willing to pay personally for their faith in Christ, in every situation. Where this commitment is lacking, the appeal of the Gospel will be weaker." This week we have a wonderful opportunity to learn more about St. Paul at our Wednesday evening Adult Formation session presented by Fr. Kevin. Everyone is invited to attend this presentation that will take place on Wednesday, November 19, starting at 7:00pm at Church of the Resurrection (3501 Cedar Lane, Portsmouth, 23703).

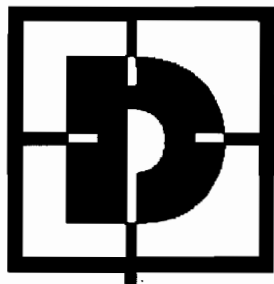
